

ESSER III PLAN USES OF FUNDS

WAPANUCKA PUBLIC SCHOOL

Wapanucka Public School has engaged in meaningful consultation with parents, Chickasaw Nation, and school staff through in person or zoom meeting collaboration to develop an ESSER III uses of funds plan. The plan was devised from information collected during consultation.

- Part 1. Wapanucka School will use ESSER III funds to implement prevention of COVID and follow CDC guidelines on reopening schools in a safe manner and conduct in-person learning. We will install air purifiers, enhance our custodial equipment, repair and replace existing HVAC systems throughout the school and purchase commercial floor cleaning machines.
- Part 2. . Wapanucka School will use ESSER III funds to implement prevention of COVID and follow CDC guidelines on reopening schools in a safe manner and conduct in-person learning. We will have staff development to address COVID issues mentally, academic and emotionally. Through these staff development sessions we will discuss that all students may be affected and how to identify these students and how to address these issues. We will start an after school program. This will cost 180,000 dollars. We will enhance our summer school program by adding 2 more classes. This will cost 30,000 dollars. Hopefully this will close or correct the emotional and academic gap created by COVID. Instructional and Non-Instructional personnel will receive a \$250.00 stipend if they take the COVID vaccine to decrease the chance of spreading COVID.
- Part 3. Wapanucka Public School will spend its remaining ARP ESSER III funds consistent with the uses authorized under Section 2001(e) of the ARP Act. The remaining amount, after reserving 20% for academic loss, will be spent following all guidelines put into place by the Oklahoma State Department of Education. We will purchase new copiers for printers because of the increase in coping for distance learning. Monthly utility costs if a decrease in enrollment should occur due to COVID, Fuel costs to reduce expenses from the General Fund balance if a decrease in enrollment should occur due to COVID.
- Part 4. Wapanucka School will consider the needs of all students including the following: Homeless students, Mental Health needs, Low-Income families, English Learners, Foster Care students, Migratory students.

Wapanucka will provide meals year round to all low income students.

We have no migratory students but if we have any enrolled we will provide them with a chrome book and hotspot so they can have access to the internet to help them with their education. They will be provided meals if the need is present.

Wapanucka homeless students will be provided with any materials, chrome book, and hotspot for the best learning possible for these students.

Our English learner students will be provided extra help with Paraprofessionals with their English and any other classes that they need help in.

Wapanucka will provide Foster students with school supplies, after school tutoring, and summer school as needed.

Wapanucka School will partner with Acellus, and purchase an online social and emotional program that will help the mental health and provide counseling materials to ensure all students' mental health is addressed. Our first American students will be provided counseling from either Choctaw or Chickasaw Tribe for their tribal members. All we have to do is call and their mental health issues will be addressed through the tribe.

Wapanucka will team with Choctaw Nation to have summer school and afterschool tutoring for elementary students by looking at the test scores. Those students who have fallen behind in core academic areas will be targeted, but all students will have access to summer school and after school tutoring.
